Community Futures Wood Buffalo provides coaching, training, and access to capital to help entrepreneurs start and small to medium sized businesses expand and/or diversify. Our dedicated Board recognizes that our Region's economy is strengthened as result of this work.

Community Futures Wood Buffalo is recruiting new Board Members to provide governance leadership to this well-established (30 years) organization. Priority is to be given to candidates who are representative of the Region's Indigenous community and/or small business, who are experienced in financial, education, legal services, municipal leadership, and those that reside outside the City of Fort McMurray.

Community Futures Wood Buffalo is interested in candidates who fill the gaps identified in our Board skill matrix; particularly candidates with proven leadership skills in administration, Indigenous affairs, education, marketing, human resources and municipal governance.

The Board of Directors meets the 2nd to last Tuesday of every month; normally in the late afternoons. Directors unable to attend in person actively participate in meetings via conference call or webinar. There are 3 Standing Committees of the Board.

Directors are expected to provide governance leadership through active participation on the Board, to act as ambassadors for the organization, attend events, and to connect Community Futures to business, government, professional, and community networks. Board members have legal and fiduciary responsibility for the organization. The Board is responsible for hiring and overseeing the Executive Director.
