Community Futures Wood Buffalo continues to forge new relationships within the local community and strives to be the catalyst for change in the visitation and delivery of programs to under-served communities within our region. Specifically, our staff and board visited Fort Chipewyan to partner in programming that would foster economic resiliency through learning circles for our Indigenous community members.

Another success story would be the delivery of the "2019 Lemonade Day", training to the Community of Anzac. Within this local community, we had almost twenty children sign up to participate in this program which teaches children the fundamentals of money management and starting a small business. Not only did we impact the learning of the local children but had the opportunity to also engage with parents. It was a fantastic way to bring entrepreneurship to this primarily indigenous community south of Fort McMurray.

Locally, Community Futures Wood Buffalo participated as a Committee Member in the development of a pilot Business Visitation Program, which was being championed by the Business Support Network. The pilot program's goal was to engage with local businesses. The BSN Group visited over 325 businesses to share information, make

connections, and learn about common business concerns. A total of 115 surveys were completed with the respondents primarily representing businesses with 0-9 employees in the service/retail sector.

We also learned that respondents wanted to see more mentorship, networking opportunities and online resources. Their feedback enables us to try to create relevant programming which will meet their needs going forward.

In partnership with YMCA Northern Alberta, Community Futures Wood Buffalo also delivered an all-day Customer Service workshop to over 25 participants. This workshop was well received with exceptional results. The participants primarily women, were extremely engaged, and wanted to learn more. We will be sure to delivery more programming soon - post COVID.
